Academy Targets

Agreed targets

1. Ensure all students make good progress and that examination cohorts achieve a positive value added score above 2017-2018 results.
2. Ensure that quality first teaching incorporates a range of effective differentiation that meets the needs of all learners.
3. Ensure that all students have a rich and varied educational experience with particular emphasis on the successful implementation of the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme.
4. Close the attainment gap of all disadvantaged students by improving their attendance to the national average for all students. (95%)
5. Ensure that careers provision hits at least 90% in all 8 categories of the Gatsby Benchmarks when compared with national averages.



Grade 9

Ofqual have stated that fewer grade 9's will be awarded in each subject and that only students with exceptional performance will attain this - top 2- 4% nationally

11 students achieved a grade 9 in one subject or more

We achieved 19 grade 9s in total

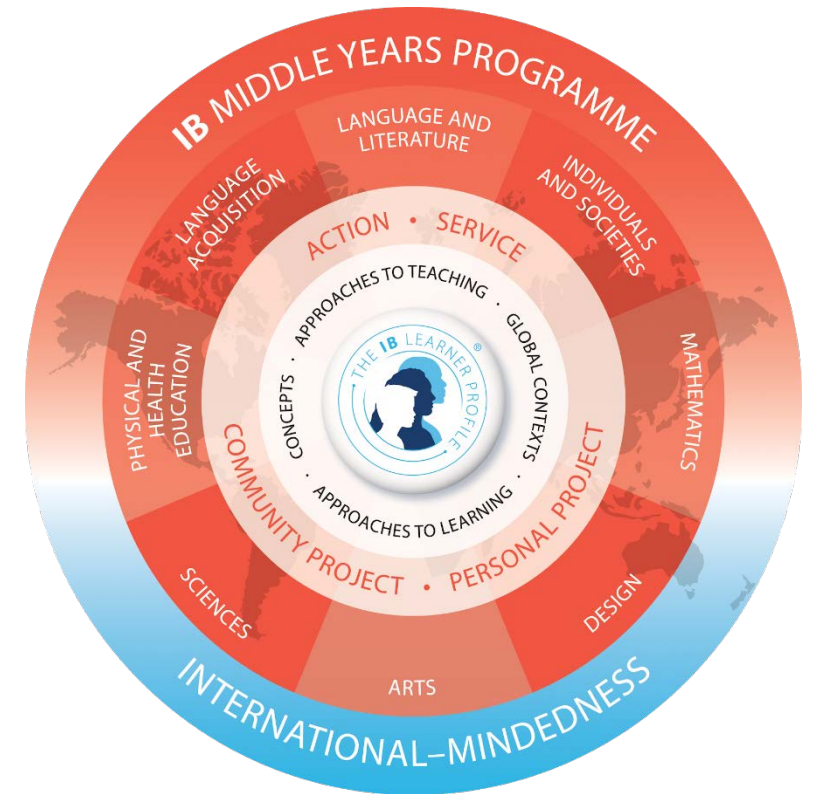

Interdisciplinary Learning

Quality interdisciplinary education invites students to integrate concepts, theories, methods and tools from two or more disciplines to deepen their understanding of a complex topic.

For example, how cities grow, why the climate is changing, how to make new media art.

In so doing, interdisciplinary instruction enlists students' multiple capabilities and prepares them to solve problems, create products or ask questions in ways that go beyond single disciplinary perspectives.
