What does this course involve at Key Stage 3?

History at key stage 3 involves developing historical skills and processes such as evidential understanding, change and consequence, significance, similarities and differences as well as cause and consequence. We teach this through a variety of historical enquiries.

What do you need to be successful in this course?

To be successful a student needs to demonstrate detailed knowledge of periods studied in depth, as well as a wider knowledge of patterns over time. This should be secured within a chronological framework that encompasses local, British and World History. Students should be able to make links between periods when demonstrating historical skills.

1. The Industrial Revolution /Public Health – How beneficial was the Industrial Revolution for everyone?
2. The British Empire - Was the British Empire a good or bad thing?
3. Slavery - What was the impact of slavery?
4. Civil Rights in the USA - How did the civil rights movement develop in the USA?
5. The Great War - What impact did The Great War have on Britain?
6. British History Heroes - To what extent did key individuals make a difference to British society?
